
Teaching your Dog to Take a Breath (On Cue)





Getting the Behavior

Select a scented item to use. Hold the scented item a few inches from your dog's nose. When aur dog breathes in to sniff the item (e.g. nostrils flaring number out, chest movement), say "yes" in a calm, and the consistency of the second give them a transfer of the item.

Once you dog an breathe in response to you holding the item next to y an empt to your nose. When your dog breathes in response by "ye and feed a treat.

Star in from of your dog and give them to oue "breathe", follow discounting your finger to your nose. When your dog breathes it as use, say "yes" and feed a treat.





Adding Distractions

Once your dog can breathe when cued, practice in a low distraction environment, such as the backyard or a very quiet outdoor location. Dial up the distraction level very slowly. If at any point the behavior falls apart, return to a less distracting environment and practice it some more, then build back up.
